We have several new large buildings going up in the area, including the \$12.1 million-dollar facility to consolidate the regional Oregon Department of Human Services, Child Welfare and Self-Sufficiency programs and the new Coos Health and Wellness building. I would like to extend a special warm welcome to the new Bay Area Chamber members this quarter: Bigfoot PC LLC, Ocean Breeze Flowers, Mick Reeds Auto Service Center, Wavz, Marler Appraisal Services, Martin Callery, ORCA Communications, Barrels Bar, The Social, Adeline Leard - DoTerra Advocate, PacWest Drone Services LLC and Shana Jo's Red Door Reality. We are happy to have you be a part of the Chamber Family.

Believe it or not, it will soon be time to vote again in our local elections. As community leaders and business owners it is important to be informed on what will be included on the May ballot. There are big decisions to be made that could either build our community up or negatively impact our economy.

Measure 6-163: Coos Bay School Bond: Last year, the Coos Bay BEST Bond Committee reviewed the Coos Bay School District's facilities and with the help of over seven years of research, developed a plan to update, improve and expand Coos Bay Schools. Measure 6-163 is a \$66 million school bond that will be on the May 2017 ballot. With the bond money, the district would: 1) Replace the Harding Building (built in 1924), excluding the gym, with a new 7th and 8th grade school. 2) Replace Blossom Gulch (sinking and in a tsunami zone) with a new elementary school where Eastside Elementary stands today.3) Renovate and expand Madison Elementary School.

4) Renovate and improve Millicoma and Sunset Intermediate Schools. **The BEST Bond Committee has agreed to give a private tour for the Chamber, starting at Blossom Gulch, Friday April 8th at 4:30 PM** If you would like to learn more, visit the Coos Bay BEST Bond on facebook (@cbbestbond) or on the web at cbbestbond.weebly.com or send an e-mail to cbbestbond@gmail.com

Measure 6-162: Measure 6-162 is an ill-conceived, poorly-written proposal to create more unnecessary government regulation, ban the transit of fuels on highways and rails, burden taxpayers with new costs, and block future business development and job creation in our community. If passed by voters, it would send a signal to the rest **of Oregon, and the world, that Coos County is essentially "closed for business."** This harmful measure is being pushed by activists with backing from out-of-state groups that are seeking to kill jobs and industry. The Bay Area Chamber of Commerce, after a thorough review of the proposal, has voted to strongly oppose Coos County Measure 6-162 and urges you to also reject this unconstitutional and economically damaging Measure. 


