Free Night at the Museum

The eight local history museums that are supporting local Ballot Measure 6-153 (Coos County Historical Fund) invite the public to attend a free event at the Coos History Museum (1210 N. Front St., Coos Bay) on Thursday, October 6th starting at 6:30 pm. Several representatives from local history museums will make a short presentation about the ballot measure in the main community room after which attendees may view the Coos History Museum exhibits with no admission charge. Those who attend the presentation can also join a tour "behind the exhibits" by visiting rooms normally not open to the public where exhibit prep and other museum operations take place. Light refreshments will be served.

Ballot Measure 6-153 would establish secure funding for eight history museums in Powers, Bandon, Myrtle Point, Coquille, and Coos Bay by collecting a property tax based on ten cents per thousand assessed value. Supporters view the measure as a potential economic boost to the region as well as an important component of local education, culture, and pride. Coos County residents would be able to attend any of these museums free of charge if the measure passes.

What's going on with our BACC Committee's!?!

Transportation

- Committee members have been promoting "Save Our Streets" a Local Fuel Tax presentation for the Cities of North Bend & Coos Bay. Presentations have included Open House at the Cities of North Bend and Coos Bay, the Chamber Transportation Committee, the Chamber LAT, south Coast Development Council, NB-CB Rotary Club, the Chamber Tourism Committee, Professional engineers Organization, and the Eastside Neighborhood Watch. Voters will be able to decide the outcome on Election Day, November 8, 2016.
- Members of SWACT (South West Area Commission on Transportation) have elected and appointed new members. New members include Jennifer Groth as an Aviation Modal Alternate and Ron Kutch as Coos County Alternate Stakeholder.
- Members of the Transportation Committee and SWACT met recently with the Joint Committee on Transportation Preservation and Modernization in Newport. It included a tour of Newport's regional transportation facilities and a round table with coastal members of North West Area Commission Transportation, South West Area Commission on Transportation, Lane Area Commission on Transportation and the Cascades West Area Commission on Transportation.
- Rick Skinner as the Vice Chair of the South West ACT represented the partnership and support of the ACT's and identified transportation needs and provided support by speaking out about the value these projects bring. These groups put a local voice at the table, improving the agency's ability to move necessary transportation projects forward.
